- **Activity websites were reviewed a few months into EGEE-II**
  - Mainly branding
  - Only homepage of activities
  - Minimal workload for the activities
- **Similar look&feel but still diversity:**
  - Public website
  - Technical website
  - Activity website (EGEE-II template)
  - Activity website (EGEE template)
  - User Portal and NA4 site – new CMS

- **Activity websites started off as internal websites but became the place to find technical information**
  - don't do either of the functions very well
- **Information often out of date**
  - Activities don't use their website to carry out their work
  - Projects bad image
- **Problem to find information**
  - Many pages don't have search function
  - Information targeted to people who are familiar with the project
- **Apart from EDMS no Data archiving system in place**

- **Probably go for an extended public website**
  - Includes technical information for different groups in one place
  - Includes search function
- **Content**
  - What are different people looking for?
    - Users
    - Resource providers
    - Developers
    - Public, Funding Agencies, Press
  - Which pages/information are the most looked at (analyse web statistics of ALL pages)
  - Which information do people need? E.g. FAQ from GGUS
- **Implementation**
  - Central system with a technical writer
  - Central system with each activity providing input
  - Template with each activity implementing their part
